- 1. Additions/Deletions to the Agenda, Approval of the Agenda:

- 2. Approval of the June 15th,2023, SCWG Meeting Minutes
 - Commissioner Thomas made a motion to approve.
 - Commissioner Lemos followed with a second motion.

- 3. Membership Committee Report (Co-chair/Commission Lemos) Update
 Briefly introductions to welcome new commissioners and provided an update of
 vacancy for City of Vallejo. Several members of the SCWG met in June remotely and
 interviewed several candidates who were interested in joining SCWG. After careful
 discussion, the Appointments Committee recommended Kimberlee Staking to fill the
 second Adult-at-Large vacancy and McKenzie Mashburn for the Youth-at-Large.
 Both new commissioners were present at the August meeting. IN addition,
 Commissioner Edwina Perez-Santiago joined the board as a newly-appointed
 commissioner representing the City of Fairfield. Commissioner Lemos announced
 August 28, 2023 is "Orientation Day" for the new commissioners.
 September meeting: Commissioner Lemos also announced that the term for the
 current Executive Committee will be up in October. Open positions are available for
 the Executive Committee which will be discussed next month.
- 4. Period Project 2023 (Chair Hamilton/Caroline Auxier from Touro University) Update Caroline made me a suggestion to lower the amount on Square to \$10 and also add the phrase "unhoused persons/individuals." Chair Hamilton will make the two suggested changes. Kick-off Period Project begins on August 19, 2023 and approximately two months for the drive. November 4, 2023 is the Packing Party.

Commissioners Lemos, Madison, and Chair Hamilton will have access to the Facebook page to post. Two meetings are scheduled to provide updates to the board: September 7th and October 5th. Meetings are virtual (Zoom).

5. Birth Justice 2024 (Commissioners Henderson and Madison):
Two dates are proposed for 2024: February 17 or February 24.
Commissioner Henderson suggested hosting two venues for the 2024 event.
Venue options: Touro University, Mare Island, or County facilities in Vallejo as a venue. A discussion of daycare was brought up with the possibility of partnering with First 5 and Jameelah Hand with Watch Me Grow for daycare options.
Starting next month, the Birth Justice Working Group will begin to meet to on the 2nd Wednesday of each month. First meeting is Wednesday, September 13 from 6-7PM via Zoom. Meetings will be monthly until the chair(s) will change to bi-weekly meetings.
Caroline from Touro University suggested reaching out to the Medical Students for Choice Organization at Touro University as a partner to collaborate.

6. Women in Money Conference (Chair Kay Kelley):
